A New Drama Club Takes to the Stage

Did you hear what Horton heard? Catch a glimpse of the Cat in the Hat? These days, if you enter our school after hours, be prepared to enter the mystical Jungle of Nool or the joyful town of Whoville.

It has been over seventeen years since the school last committed to a full-scale production like *Seussical JR!* Yet that did not hinder an enthusiastic group of parents, with the support of *Principal Amy Bauer*, from undertaking a new after-school drama program for K through 8th-grade students. Dr. Seuss's books come to life with the characters from Horton the Elephant, the Grinch, and, of course, the Cat in the Hat. This May, Horton will discover a speck of dust floating through the air, containing the Whos—and fun will surely ensue! Since January, practices have been underway for a hundred Whos, along with the Cat in the Hat, played by sixth-grader *Carson Victoria*, Horton, played by eighth-grader *Cody Schrock*, and his friend Jo-Jo, played by fourth-grader *Maria Malatesta*. Additionally, *Seussical*, *Jr.* offers an array of thirteen supporting characters played by other talented students.

Last spring, after some parents inquired about a theater program during the H&S meeting, the program director and musical director, **Mrs. Meggie Gribbin**, began asking other parents, "If we bring a musical to SMM, do you think we would get a good turnout?" The answer was a resounding "yes!" Mrs. Gribbin expressed, "Many of our children have been involved with other local programs, and while I am so thankful for those, I knew we could do something right on our stage. Word of mouth spread, and a team started to form."



Mrs. Katie Knee, co-director, Mrs. Jessica Malatesta, choreographer, and alum Mrs. Kate Smith, producer extraordinaire, eagerly jumped in to bring the musical to the students. Mrs. Gribbin added, "In addition, we have a team of parents who help out at rehearsals, take attendance, guide the JR choir of grades K-3 students to their spots, (continued on back page)

Together, we came to honor our cherished pastor of twenty-four years, **Rev. Monsignor Ralph Chieffo**, who will be officially retiring this June. The event also marked a significant milestone in our fundraising efforts, netting over half a million dollars for the school, breaking all previous records.

Deacon Joseph Boyle told the *Delco Times*, "Msgr. Chieffo has been a beacon of light, showing the St. Mary Magdalen Parish Community the path of missionary discipleship through his example. He has met each of his flock where they are and guided us all towards our shared calling, the road to sainthood. When our hearts are restless, he leads us through the intercession of the Blessed Mother to find solace in her Son, providing us with a constant source of guidance and reassurance."

Long-time parishioners and alumni parents Mary Ann and Don Saleski and Patty and Gary Holloway oversaw and planned this delightful evening with the support of current school parents Alyson and Brian Grandieri and Carolyn and Mike Longo, as co-chairs, along with dedicated volunteers and parish staff.

The night was made even more meaningful by the presence of Msgr. Ralph's family members, including his siblings **Angelo Chieffo** and **Theresa Kilcur**, many friends including fellow priests and deacons, a wide array of devoted parishioners, along with **Archbishop Nelson Pérez**.

Principal **Amy Bauer** beautifully captured the essence of our pastor's leadership, saying, "Monsignor Chieffo's greatest passion is spreading the good news about the love of God and the joy of our Catholic faith to our young people. Every day at 8 AM, our principal, **Mrs. Amy Crawford Bauer**, focuses on the 369 students by initiating a positive morning routine. This ritual includes morning prayer, the Pledge of Allegiance, the school's Code of Conduct pledge, and the daily announcements, including birthdays, all delivered with a steady hand and a radiating smile. Afterward, the children and their teachers return to their homerooms to prepare for the first class of the day.

For Mrs. Bauer, transitioning from an assistant principal at Cardinal O'Hara to principal of SMM appeared seamless; however, that is due to her unwavering dedication and care, in full view each school day, and the many hours in between to ensure that the best practices are utilized for the advancement of students and staff alike. The best part of the day for Mrs. Bauer is seeing the students as they enter the campus. As part of her vision and mission for the school, Mrs. Bauer expressed, "The presence of faith-based learning, sense of community, daily expressions of faith, religious beliefs and spirituality, as well as actions and activities motivated by Catholic principles are what set parochial schools apart. I focus on developing our community among teachers, staff, students, and families."

Miss Mia Anthony, a new aide in Pre-K3, shared, "My days at SMM are filled with joy and laughter. The students in our class are not just curious and spirited, they are a part of a vibrant community. They light up when I greet them in the morning, and I witness their infectious enthusiasm as **Mrs. Mary Beth Boyle** guides and teaches them." Mrs. Bauer added, "If we feel invested as a community with a common purpose, we will likely stay, become engaged, and encourage others. These components are not just necessary for Catholic schools to survive, they are what make our students thrive."

This year, our students have been the driving force behind a myriad of new and traditional activities. Inspired by our dedicated faculty and staff, they organized our annual Cereal Box Dominoes Day on April 19, gathering over 350 boxes of cereal for area food banks. On April 8, they celebrated the solar eclipse with a burst of creativity, singing and dancing to 'Total Eclipse of the Heart' and 'Here Comes the Sun.' They also engaged in science-focused activities to learn more about solar eclipses and even managed to catch a glimpse through the clouds with special eclipse glasses provided by the school.

During Catholic Schools Week, our school was abuzz with many activities and events. Students assembled over two hundred "Hope Bags" for cancer treatment patients in January, a testament to their compassion and empathy. Thanks to the generosity of our school families, we collected a \$500 donation for Bringing Hope Home, a non-profit founded by parishioner Paul Isenberg. Students celebrated their teachers, staff, volunteers, service people, and more. Throughout CSW, students engaged in activities including dressing like teachers or staff members during "Teacher Swap," enjoying a Chipotle lunch and assemblies, and participating in the annual Religion and Spelling Bees.

Miss Anthony sums it all up, saying, "Our students are unique, kind, talented, funny, and genuinely love to learn. The invaluable moments are countless. St. Mary Magdalen embodies faith, compassion, and generosity, and I am truly blessed to be a part of it."









Famous Americans on Display

At the end of February, the 4th graders presented a significant class project, an interactive living **Wax Museum of Famous Americans**, to the school. Upon returning after the new year, they diligently worked on their project. Each student chose a famous American they were interested in learning more about from a curated list and began researching their selections.

The students didn't just pick their favorites; they each had to use their persuasive skills to convince their teacher, **Miss Erica Braunlinger**, why they should get their first choice. Once they had their individual, they set to work using reliable digital sources, such as the *Smithsonian's History Explorer*. They then delved into the resources to extract information about the famous American's personal life, from childhood and adulthood, including their professional lives, accomplishments, and impacts, and added a quote. They crafted all of their knowledge into well-structured paragraphs. The students concluded their research papers by stating their opinions on why their individual should receive the designation as a 'Famous American.' Finally, they used parts of the information to write a speech using the first-person point of view, which they read out loud at the Wax Museum.

One of the most remarkable aspects of this project was its interdisciplinary nature. Miss Braunlinger remarked, "The students applied what they had learned from their various special classes, showcasing their ability to integrate knowledge." In technology class, they skillfully compiled the information into a newsletter on Canva®, demonstrating their digital literacy. They learned about citing sources in library class, showing their understanding of academic integrity. They creatively sketched their backdrop in art class, displaying their artistic skills. They had to choose an image or scene that was meaningful to their individual, showcasing their understanding of the subject matter. They then brought their final pieces to completion, including an entire outfitted look of the American, with the guidance of Miss Braunlinger. Their coordinated efforts then went on display as a visual Wax Museum, as seen in some of the above photos from the event held in the gymnasium.

oversee dismissal, and work with students on the stage crew, along with anything else it takes to put on a show of this size."

Mrs. Gribbin knew they had many student dancers, singers, gymnasts, and actors and wanted a show featuring as many of them as possible. Seussical JR is the perfect choice due to its many featured roles and generous production numbers. Plus, ten students are participating in the 'Who Crew' making props and designing the event program—and they will also help run the show's technology. The team was astounded by the enthusiasm and turnout, with 110 students, a third of the student body, participating in the show. "Admittedly, I never expected to get such a huge turnout for a first show," adding, "It shows that this theater program has a bright future!"

At the beginning of March, Mrs. Knee said the students practiced for about four to six hours a week." To say we are so proud of these students would be an understatement." Singing and dancing on stage is no small feat in a show almost entirely told through song! To help ensure the show's vision, other Catholic schools were happy to lend SMM some lead costumes and even a stage extension for the show, or as Mrs. Gribbin put it, "Go big or go home."
